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13+ CE ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

For Latin and Greek there is no change to the published dates for the written examinations.

13+ CE ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE

LEVELS OF ENTRY

If appropriate and in consultation with the senior school, pupils may be entered at a lower Level of the Latin paper than originally anticipated. It may be found helpful for such consultation to include apprising the senior schools of exactly what syllabus content has been covered to date and what is anticipated to be covered between now and July, and to seek guidance and reassurance accordingly.

GRAMMATICAL CONTENT

Teachers will no doubt have their own ways of auditing and summarising the grammatical content covered by their pupils, but if assessing this is a problem, downloadable checklists, originally designed for self-assessment, are available from the home page at www.rcbass.co.uk. Here too can be found downloadable 'Referenda' booklets for the various Levels, summarising grammar, syntax and the prescribed vocabulary.

VOCABULARY

Colleagues may well have their own methods of encouraging the consolidation of vocabulary - an aspect which may have been subject to some slippage during the lockdowns - before June.

Suffice it here to mention that searching for CE Latin vocabulary (vel sim.) at www.memrise.com will yield a good range of results, and that the Papiatum app - geared to the three CE Levels - is an inexpensive and effective vocabulary-learning resource for those with Apple devices.
